INPUT Research Methodology

In preparing this list, INPUT relied on data provided by the Federal Procurement Data System. The FPDS data covers contract actions reported by federal agencies in the executive branch to the FPDS-NG on contracts exceeding \$25,000 in value. It is important to note that the spending data does not include spending from the following sources:

- **Spending on Subcontractors**
FPDS only collects spending by the government with prime contractors. Contractor receipts from subcontracts are not included.
- **Spending by the Intelligence Community**
Organizations, such as the CIA and NSA, are exempt from reporting their contract spending with the FPDS and, therefore, contractor receipts from these organizations are not factored into the rankings.
- **Spending by Congress, Judicial Branch, or Quasi-Governmental Organizations**
Some organizations, such as elements of the legislative and judicial branches, are not required to report contract spending to the FPDS, nor are quasi-governmental organizations, such as the U.S. Postal Service.

To determine the top 150 federal IT contractors, INPUT examines a sub-set of the FPDS data based on contract actions reported under IT-related Product / Service Codes (PSCs). INPUT includes those PSCs that it deems to be IT-related. It is important to note that in selecting the PSCs to be included in IT, a restrictive view of PSCs is taken so that spending that is not strictly IT-related does not distort the rankings.

In order to ensure that the data and rankings are as accurate as possible, INPUT invests over 10,000 hours of analyst time annually to structure, clean, and analyze the FPDS data. INPUT's [Federal Vendor Profiles](#), [Federal Opportunities](#), [Federal Market Analysis](#) and [Federal Task Order](#) subscription programs provided supporting data and analysis.
