WorldWide Technology ranks No. 3 'diversity business' in U.S.

WorldWide Technology Inc. was ranked No. 3 on [DiversityBusiness.com](#)'s 2003 list of the top 100 U.S. multicultural businesses.

The list ranked businesses nationwide on 2002 revenue. WorldWide had \$800 million in revenue. It was the only firm in the St. Louis metro area to make the top 100 list. The company is owned by David Steward and specializes in electronic procurement and logistics, and information technology.

ETI in Columbia, Mo., ranked No. 95 with \$53 million in revenue. ETI, or Electenergy Technologies Inc., sells energy conservation supplies, products and services.

"Diversity businesses are a growing force in the U.S. economy, and a force to be reckoned with," said Kenton Clarke, chief executive of Computer Consulting Associates International, the company that built DiversityBusiness.com, in a statement. "This is a whole business segment that can carry its own, that provides jobs and valuable products and services, and generates wealth for their communities."

Chesterfield, Mo.-based Rose International ranked No. 177 on the top 500 list of multicultural businesses with \$30 million in revenue. The information technology consulting company is owned by Himanshu Bhatia, Gulab Bhatia and Eric Token. St. Louis-based Mosley Construction, owned by Kem Mosley, ranked No. 466 with \$13 million in revenue.
