World Wide wins \$15M Alaska contract

World Wide Technology Inc. (WWT) said Tuesday that it won a \$15 million IT procurement contract with the state of Alaska's Department of Administration.

The company said in a release that it has expanded its operations in Alaska by opening new offices in Anchorage and employing 29 people in the state.

Under the terms of the contract, WWT will deploy 15,000 IP (Internet protocol) phones in Anchorage, Juneau and Fairbanks, Alaska. The IP telephone migration contract is focused on telecommunication integration support, according to the release.

Joseph Koenig, president of WWT, said in a statement, "WWT is committed to successfully moving the State of Alaska to a converged, enterprise-wide network to meet the State's telecommunication needs today and well into the future." He said the company has worked closely with the state of Alaska, increasing the project's pace and schedule to minimize service disruptions.

Based in St. Louis, World Wide Technology Inc. is a technology systems integrator that serves the commercial, government and telecom sectors. The company employs more than 1,000 people and is one of the largest privately held companies in St. Louis.
